African Hep B Network Projects

- Surveys related to HBV and HCC knowledge and attitudes have focused on general awareness, vaccination for pediatric providers, reasons for not vaccinating, and difference between East and West Africa

 - No translation is available currently, but in the next few years will try to show the effectiveness of the app and get funding for translation to local languages.
- Point of Care testing for HBV and HCC using ultrasound in Tanzania Emergency Department

Questions

- What to do with limited resources: Focus on the big messages about dos and don't for transmission and interact with local government
 - The biggest challenge is awareness to get people to know about it and raise it to the level of local government repeatedly to improve funding.
 - o Find local funding sources and attract volunteers to help with non-profit work.
- How to get started with hepatitis work in Africa: Pick a place where you know the people and

where those people are just as excited as you are about the idea

- Work with the local communities and start with data to show people that there is a problem there and how you plan to fix it.
- One of the calls that we plan for this upcoming year will focus on technical assistance for small grassroots groups and coalitions interested in hepatitis B elimination in Africa.
