- About us: The Coalition Against Hepatitis for People of African Origin (CHIPO) is a community coalition co-founded and led by the Hepatitis B Foundation focused on addressing hepatitis B in African communities in the United States.
- Resources tailored to the community, ongoing webinars, coalition calls and information on hepatitis B awareness, education, prevention, and updates on research.

### African Coalition for Hepatitis B Advocacy (ABAC)

**Background:** In 2024 in partnership with the Society on Liver Disease in Africa (SOLDA) the Hepatitis B Foundation launched a survey to gather information on the landscape of hepatitis B activities across Africa. Over 300 individuals, groups, organizations and researchers completed the survey and represented over 23 countries. Groups were participating in hepatitis B awareness, testing, linkage to care and treatment, advocacy, family counseling, vaccination, and patient support groups in their outreach. 97% of the individual respondents expressed interested in joining a community network or coalition that would help support and build capacity for their work. Individual survey participants also expressed Awareness, connecting with others, organization and capacity building, strategies for screening, integration, collaboration with local ministries of health, advocacy, addressing stigma and discrimination. Per the request of the individual participants in this survey the African Hepatitis B Advocacy Coalition was founded.

**ABAC Mission:** "To unite and build up African organizations, communities, and healthcare systems in the fight against hepatitis B through capacity-building, resource mobilization, data-sharing, and advocacy, with a focus on empowering patient voices, expanding access to screening, vaccination, and treatment, and achieving the World Health Organization elimination targets."

**ABAC Vision:** "Dedicated to achieving a healthy and hepatitis B-free Africa, where every community has equitable access to testing, prevention, management and treatment."
